

Our mission is to make contribution to improvement of overall quality of healthcare and spread of evidence-based medicine in China through various exchange and professional education programs and medical publications in both English and Chinese.

To disseminate advanced medical knowledge, to focus on health of the Asian American population, and to encourage mainland Chinese physicians to publish in Western-based medical publication, ACMES has been publishing "North America Journal of Medicine and Science (NAJMS)" (http://najms.net) and the Chinese language "North American Journal of



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Medicine and Health" (http://najms.org) since 2008. NAJMS is based on latest basic medical and clinical research, targeting the perspective of health care disparities in minority populations, controversies in multidisciplinary areas, and complementary medicine. NAJMS is expected to be included in SCI within a year and a half.



ACMES IMD (国际医师项目)

To "internationalize" China's healthcare and to enhance exchange between Chinese and American medical communities, **ACMES** plans to collaborate with leading US hospitals and academic institutions to bring 1,000+ leading Chinese physicians of different disciplines to the US for professional training over the next five years. In collaboration

with Joslin Diabetes Center, our inaugural program is a Diabetes program for leading Chinese endocrinologists, planned for June 2011.

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Samuel Mok

Samuel Tinsing Mok is the Managing Member of Condor International Advisors, LLC, a Washington DC based management consulting firm. Condor International Advisors provides strategic and innovative relationship management and advisory services to domestic and international clients in both Federal and private sectors.

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Mr. Mok served as the Chief Financial Officer of the U.S. Department of Labor from January 2001 to May 2007. After being appointed to the position by President George W. Bush, Mr. Mok was confirmed by the United States Senate in January 2002. He previously serves as Chief Financial Officer and Comptroller of the U.S. Department of the Treasury, appointed by former Treasury Secretary James Baker. Mr. Mok is one of the highest-ranking Asian Americans in George W. Bush Administration and is regarded as a leader of the Chinese-American community.



Alexander Leaf, MD

Dr. Alexander Leaf has been honored as the fellow of US National Academy of Sciences and the Jackson Professor of Clinical Medicine, Emeritus, Harvard University. He served as chairman of the

Department of Preventive Medicine at Harvard for 10 years. He has four students who won Nobel Prize. He is the pioneer in study of the omega-3 of fish oil and proposed the preventive effect for fatal cardiac infarction, and established research lab of fatty acid metabolism in MGH. He has published over 300 articles in the PNAS and other highly respected journals like Science and Nature and New England Journal of Medicine and he received several prestigious awards including the 1995 George M. Kober medal and the 1997 A.N. Richards Award, Nathaniel Bowditch Award by the Trustees of the MGH, Ether Dag Service Award by MGH.

various oratorios such as




Handel's "Messiah", Hayden's "Creation", Bach's Poulenc's "Gloria".

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Liver Cancer Free Campaign: Mobilizing Public Support for Congressional Funding for Viral Hepatitis Research and Prevention Programs

Few in the general public know that Hepatitis B virus (HBV) is a leading cause of cancer in humans, most notably liver cancer, the fifth leading type of cancer in the world. As many as 2 million Americans and 500 million people worldwide have viral hepatitis B, which accounts for 80% of all liver cancers worldwide. Most notably, Asian Americans have higher prevalence of viral hepatitis B than other racial and ethnic groups. Of the estimated 2 million chronic hepatitis B patient in the US, over half are Asian Americans. Among API men living in California, liver cancer ranks as a leading cause of cancer death: #1 for Laotian Americans, #2 for Vietnamese and Cambodian Americans, #4 for Chinese and Korean Americans and #5 for Filipino Americans. ...,more at NAJMS. 2010;3(1):41-42, www.najms.net

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
