Faculty:

Calvin Pan, MD, PhD; FACP, FACG; Dr.Pan is Associate Professor of Medicine, Mount Sinai School of Medicine, he is board certified in Internal Medicine and Gastroenterology, serves as Director of Clinical Research and Hepatology, Mount Sinai Service at Elmhurst Hospital Center. He received his medical degree from Guangzhou Medical College, finished his medical residency in The Albert Einstein College of Medicine and fellowship in Gastroenterology in State University of New York at Stony Brook. Dr.Pan has been a well-known hepatologist specialized in viral hepatitis and chronic liver diseases. He serves as principal investigator for many clinical trials and he has been invited as speakers for national and international liver conference and numerous hepatitis CME programs. He has been invited as reviewers and editors for several well know journals and serves as leader for several medical organizations. He received many awards including National Leadership Award by National Republican Congressional Committee 2002, American Top Physician honored by Consumers' Research Council of America 2004. He was elected as Fellow of the American College of Gastroenterology. He has been a core member ACMES, associate editor for North American Journal of Medicine and Science, co-Acting Chief Editor for our recent special hepatitis issue.

Shiaoyu Lee, MD; Dr.Lee is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Harvard Medical School, Attending Gynecologist of Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center. Dr.Lee finished his medical training from Taipei Medical University, did his internship in Philadelphia General Hospital and Halifax Infirmary/Dalhousie University in 1960s, finished his Ob/GYN residency in University of Ottawa and Beth Israel Hospital of Harvard. He has been a staff physician in Harvard since 1973. Dr.Lee is well known in his clinical excellence and he performed over 10,000 cases of laparoscopic female tubal sterilizations under local anesthesia, one of the largest experiences in the country and he conducted over 10 research trials, he was elected as fellow of American College of OB/GYN and invited to speak nationally and internationally. Dr.Lee is also a great teacher and community leader. He was the first "Physician of the Month" elected by "North American Journal of Medicine and Health and he is also a contributor and supporter of North American Journal of Medicine & Science.

David Lee, PhD; Dr. Lee is an associate professor at Harvard Medical School and the Director of the Bioorganic and Natural Products Laboratory at McLean Hospital. He completed his Ph.D. degree in Natural Products Chemistry at Columbia University. Dr. Lee has worked on numerous projects in drug discovery and development related to traditional Chinese medicine. Dr. Lee has contributed significantly to the development of alternative therapies for substances abuse. He is the principal investigator on a program project grant funded by the National Institutes of Health entitled "Alternative Therapies for Alcohol and Drug Abuse." Dr. Lee and his colleagues at McLean Hospital are also looking into natural remedies for depression, insomnia, and Alzheimer's disease. Dr. Lee received an institutional development award in 1985. He has published 100 papers and holds 15 U.S. and international patents. Dr.Lee is also an associate editor of North American Journal of Medicine & Science. In this presentation, he will speak on the "Alternative Therapies for Primary Care Medicine" with emphasis on the rediscovery of Traditional Chinese remedies.

Chuangyun Gao, MD, Dr.Gao is a staff physician in Joslin Diabetes Center and BIDMC, Clinical Instructor of Harvard Medical School. Dr.Gao graduate from Beijing Medical University and also received Master of Science from Ohio State University, she finished her Internal Medicine Residency in University of Texas Medical Branch at Austin and Endocrinology fellowship in Joslin and BIDMC of Harvard. She is board certified in both Internal Medicine and Endocrinology, specialized in adult diabetes management, teaches in Harvard Medical School and also conduct clinical researches.

Anand Mahadevan, MD, is leading faculty physician of Department of Radiation Oncology of BIDMC, Program Director for the Stereotactic Radiosurgery Fellowship program, Instructor of Oncology, Harvard Medical School. Dr.Mahadevan completed Radiation Oncology fellowship at BIDMC with special interests in developing my expertise in Neurological, Cutaneous, Head and Neck Cancers and Stereotactic Body Radiotherapy. His unique and innovative contribution in the area of Clinical Expertise is in the establishment of Cyberknife Robotic Radiosurgery, as a new and accepted modality, for cancer treatment, he is also a co-investigator in several DFHCC and National Co-Operative Group Clinical trials and initiated clinical trials as a principal investigator, he was also awarded the Annual Best Teacher Award by the HROP residents in 2006.

Jing Liu, PhD; Dr. Liu is a licensed acupuncturist and herbalist. He was a physician in China, major in integrative medicine. He has his private clinical practice also at The Marino Center at Cambridge. Dr. Liu has been a research fellow at MGH since 1995. His research interest has been focused on Inflammation and Cancer with integrative approaches.

Zhuang Su, Ph.D; Dr. Su is the founder and president of S&T Global. He obtained his Ph.D. from Beijing Institute of Technology in 1989 and subsequently did postdoctoral research with Professor Ch. Tamm on the Pseurotin A natural product total synthesis at the University of Basel, Switzerland. From 1991 -1993, he also worked in the laboratories of the Preclinical Immunology Research of Sandoz (now Novartis) in Basel. At Sandoz, he acquired extensive knowledge in cyclosporine chemistry and structure-activity relationship. During this time, he established a fundamental process for the chemical synthesis of NIM-811 and Debio-025. NIM-811 and Debio-025 inhibit cyclophilin and are currently new classes of anti-HCV investigational drug. From 1993 -1996, he worked in the laboratory of Professor Leo Paquette at the Ohio State University, where he accomplished the key procedure for the total synthesis of taxusin and taxol. After working with Professor Jun O. Liu at MIT for the discovery of a molecular target of angiogenesis inhibitors in 1996 -1999, he founded S & T Global, and has served as President since then. He now works on custom synthesis and drug discovery.

Mark Li MD, F.A.C.S.G. Dr.Li is an Attending Physician of Washington Adventist Hospital, Coordinator of Hepatitis Project of Washington DC, and Commissioner, Maryland Community Health Resource Commission. Dr.Li is board certified in Internal Medicine and Geriatric Medicine, he was elected as a Fellow of the American College of Specialists in Geriatrics and a Fellow of American College of Ethical Physician. Dr.Li received his BA in Social Science from the University of California at Berkeley in 1972, and his medical degree from the University of Hong Kong in 1977. He finished his medical residency in Washington DC and has practiced in DC area for the last 28 years. He has also serves as Medical Director for several nursing homes and rehab centers. He is speaker for over 10 organizations covering many medical topics particularly hepatitis B. Over years Dr.Li led several large scale hepatitis projects, the results were published on top medical journals. Dr.Li is a well-known community leader and presently serves as the president of President of the Chinese American Medical Society, Mid Atlantic Chapter and vice president of American Chinese Medical Exchange Society. He is a member of the Advisory Board of the Asian Health Foundation, a member of the Maryland Hepatitis Coalition and a member of the National Viral Hepatitis Round table.
