Faculty

Keqin Hu, MD. Dr. Hu is the Director of Hepatology Services, Professor of Clinical Medicine, Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology, University of California, Irvine Medical Center. Dr. Hu is an expert in chronic liver disease, hepatitis B, hepatitis C and liver cancer. He is a national and international speaker, and principal investigator of many liver projects. He serves as the acting chief editor for the special hepatitis issue of North American Journal of Medicine & Science.

Om Genda, MD. Dr. Ganda is a board-certified specialist in Internal Medicine, Endocrinology and Metabolism, and Clinical Nutrition, a Senior Physician in the Section on Adult Diabetes, director of lipid clinic at Joslin, and an Associate Clinical Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Ganda received his medical degree from the S. M. S. Medical College of the University of Rajasthan in Jaipur, India, and completed a rotating internship at the S. M. S. Hospital. He completed a residency in medicine at the All India Institute of Medical Science in New Delhi, and a residency in medicine at Tufts University School of Medicine. Dr. Ganda subsequently completed a clinical fellowship in Endocrinology and Metabolism at Tufts University and a research fellowship in medicine at Harvard Medical School.

Linden Hu, MD. Dr. Linden Hu is Professor of Medicine at Tufts University School of Medicine and Vice Chairman for Faculty Development in the Dept. of Medicine at Tufts-New England Medical Center. The focus of his research is on Lyme disease for which he is the principal investigator of many NIH projects and has served as a planning member for recent NIAID conferences on Lyme diagnostics.

Zitao Liu, MD, PhD; Dr. Liu is Assistant Professor of Tufts University School of Medicine, Staff Physician, Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Tufts Medical Center. Dr. Liu finished his medical training in Norman Bethune University of Medical Sciences, finished his Residency of Obs & Gyn at Bronix-Lebanon Hospital center of Albert Einstein College of Medicine. He also finished his PhD in Anatomy and Cell Biology from Wayne State University School of Medicine, and postdoctoral training in Department of Pediatrics of Vanderbilt University.

Weidong Lu, MB, MPH, PhD; Dr. Lu is Instructor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School and the lead acupuncturist at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. He also is Professor in Chinese Medicine at the New England School of Acupuncture, Newton, MA. He is the first recipient of The Bernard Osher Foundation/ The National Center for Complementary and Alternative Medicine (NCCAM) CAM Practitioner Research Career Development Award (K01) from NIH. As an investigator, co-principal investigator and principal investigator, he has designed and conducted several NIH-funded acupuncture clinical trials in cancer care. His research interest focuses on evidenced-based acupuncture practice for cancer patients; Chinese herbal medicine and its interactions with western pharmaceuticals.

Le Min, MD. Dr. Min is board certified in both Internal Medicine and Endocrinology, he is a research and clinical fellow in the Department of Endocrinology, Brigham and Women's Hospital, Harvard Medical School. He finished his medical residency in Mount Sinai School of Medicine and also has PhD degree in Pharmacology from National University of Singapore. He received NIH grant with emphasis on translational research.

Hannah Lee, MD, is currently assistant professor of medicine at Tufts Medical Center, affiliated with Tufts University School of Medicine. She did her medical school at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and did both her residency and GI/ Hepatology fellowship at Tufts Medical Center. She is board certified in Internal Medicine, Gastroenterology and Transplant Hepatology. Her specialty is in both general hepatology and transplant hepatology, and she cares for patients with end-stage liver disease and liver cancer. She has special interest in viral hepatitis, particularly hepatitis B, and is the director of the Asian Pacific Wellness Program here at Tufts Medical Center. She is currently involved in two grant projects. One involves studying best practices in HBV screening in the Boston area and improving screening rates in the greater Boston Asian community. Another project she involved in is CME educational development both locally and nationally with focus on intervention in addressing key practice and knowledge gaps in HBV screening, counseling, linkage to care and adherence to clinical guidelines.

Peter Stone, MD, Dr. Stone is Associate Professor of Medicine, Harvard Medical School; Co-Director of Cardiac Care Unit, Co-Director of Samuel Levine Cardiac Unit, Department of Cardiology, Brigham and Women's Hospital. Dr. Stone graduated from Weill Medical College of Cornell University, finished his Medical Residency from University of California San Francisco, and Cardiology Fellowship from Pacific Medical Center of San Francisco. Dr. Stone's research interests focus on a variety of aspects concerning coronary artery disease, from understanding the basic and clinical vascular biology of atherosclerosis progression in animals and in man, to investigating new pharmacologic and device therapies for patients with acute and chronic coronary artery disease.
