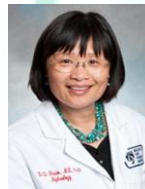
Calvin Pan, MD, PhD; FACP, FACC Dr. Pan is Associate Professor of Medicine, Mount Sinai School of Medicine, he is board certified in Internal Medicine and Gastroenterology, serves as Director of Clinical Research and Hepatology, Mount Sinai Service at Elmhurst Hospital Center. He received his medical degree from Guangzhou Medical College, finished his medical residency in The Albert Einstein College of Medicine and fellowship in Gastroenterology in State University of New York at Stony Brook. Dr. Pan has been a well-known hepatologist specialized in viral hepatitis and chronic liver diseases. He serves as principal investigator for many clinical trials and he has been invited as speakers for national and international liver conference and numerous hepatitis CME programs. He has been invited as reviewers and editors for several well know journals and serves as leader for several medical organizations. He received many awards including National Leadership Award by National Republican Congressional Committee 2002, American Top Physician honored by Consumers' Research Council of America 2004. He was elected as Fellow of the American College of Gastroenterology. Li-Li Hsiao, MD, PhD, FACP Dr. Hsiao is an associate physician at Brigham and Women's Hospital and assistant professor of Harvard Medical School. She is the founder of "Asian renal clinic, her areas of expertise include hypertension, chronic kidney disease (CKD), IgA nephropathy and herbal medicine-induced nephropathy. She is also a member of Lupus Center at Brigham and Women's Hospital. She has written over 40 manuscripts, review articles and chapters. One of the articles has been selected as "The 50 most frequently-cited articles in Physiologic Genomics" as year of 2006. Her research areas of interest include mechanisms of vascular calcification in premature aging, herbal effects on kidney injury. Dr. Hsiao has been an active member at Harvard community and has received numerous awards for her outstanding clinical work, teaching and mentoring of students at all levels including the prestigious Clifford Barger 2008-2009 Young Excellent Mentoring Award. She currently also serves as a committee member of Postgraduate education committee of American Society of Nephrology.



Mark Li MD, F.A.C.S.G. Dr. Li is an Attending Physician of Washington Adventist Hospital, Coordinator of Hepatitis Project of Washington DC, and Commissioner, Maryland Community Health Resource Commission. Dr. Li is board certified in Internal Medicine and Geriatric Medicine, he was elected as a Fellow of the American College of Specialists in Geriatrics and a Fellow of American College of Ethical Physician. Dr. Li received his BA in Social Science from the University of California at Berkeley in 1972, and his medical degree from the University of Hong Kong in 1977. He finished his medical residency in Washington DC and has practiced in DC area for the last 28 years. He has also serves as Medical Director for several nursing homes and rehab centers. He is speaker for over 10 organizations covering many medical topics particularly hepatitis B. Over years Dr. Li led several large scale hepatitis projects, the results were published on top medical journals. Dr. Li is a well-known community leader and presently serves as the president of President of the Chinese American

Medical Society, Mid Atlantic Chapter and vice president of American Chinese Medical Exchange Society. He is a member of the Advisory Board of the Asian Health Foundation, a member of the Maryland Hepatitis Coalition and a member of the National Viral Hepatitis Round table.



Guoping Shi, DSc Dr. Shi is an Associate Professor of Harvard University, he has been leading the field of cysteine protease research for the past 20 years, from their original gene identification, functional analysis, to their pathophysiological roles in immunity (autoimmune diseases), atherosclerosis, abdominal aortic aneurysms, obesity, and diabetes. His research discoveries have been widely used for developing small molecule inhibitors against human autoimmune and cardiovascular diseases. Several on-going clinical trials are based on his discoveries. He is also a world's leading scientist in mast cell studies, particularly in cardiovascular and metabolic diseases, including atherosclerosis, abdominal aortic aneurysms, obesity, and diabetes. We used animal models to prove mast cell functions in these diseases and our discoveries have already started benefiting patients who are suffering from these common human diseases.

Georgina Garcia, MD Dr. Garcia is a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist working at Children's Hospital Boston. She completed her undergraduate at Dartmouth College and went on to the University Of Iowa College Of Medicine for her medical degree. Dr. Garcia completed her adult psychiatric training at Tufts New England Medical Center and her child and adolescent psychiatry fellowship at Children's Hospital Boston. Since completion of her training Dr. Garcia has worked at the Martha Eliot Health Center, Children's Hospital Primary Care Center, and in private practice. Currently, Dr. Garcia works full time on the Pediatric Consultation Service at Children's Hospital Boston. She works as a liaison to the Cystic Fibrosis Center at Children's Hospital. Her research interests include depression in the medically ill population, delirium, Vitamin D and its relationship to mental health, and improving the mental health care systems for patients with Cystic Fibrosis.

Tamer Yacoub, MD Dr. Tamer G. Yacoub is an endocrinologist at Prima Care Endocrinology in Fall river, MA. Dr. Yacoub attended Ain-Shams University School of Medicine, Cairo, Egypt, completed a residency program at the medical center of central Massachusetts, Worcester, MA and received postgraduate training in Endocrinology at Boston University Hospital. Dr. Yacoub is board certified in the areas of Internal Medicine, Diabetes, Hypertension, And Endocrinology & Metabolism.
